## FRIENDLY PLANTS

This is the time of the year when the garden starts to burst into life after the months of winter. It is a period I love and one of great affection as 'old friends' return to greet me.

The first snowdrops, already in the garden when we came to Great Bromley, are already in bloom heralding the onset of spring. The primroses too are in flower and the daffodils are showing through the ground ready to flower for my birthday. Soon the cowslips rescued from the plough in the 1950s, will bloom. I have a special affection for them and always think of my mother when they come out.

I have roses, shrubs and trees that came from village garden days over the years, the Cheshire Home Fete and church flower

festivals. There are shrubs from an aunt and herbs from a cousin and neighbours; the dahlias arrived via the post from a very green-fingered cousin in Dorset. Some plants I have bought on days out with friends which remind me of them and the day as they 'peak' during the year.

The 'landmark' plants such as the Silver Willow and the rose 'Peace' given to us mark our 25th wedding anniversary, the azalea reminds me of a Mothering Sunday present from the children and a passionflower, now very large and outside, arrived in a small pot one Easter from my eldest son - all are precious.

Irises, grasses, pond plants plus indoor

plants all bring to mind someone as I wander round the various parts of the garden. Seeds taken over the years from friends, relatives and whilst visiting gardens on holiday have, over the years, grown and matured - always giving a satisfying feeling that it has been nurtured to maturity.

The loss of a plant, through whatever reason, is always sad but when it has an 'attachment' to someone the loss becomes personal and real regret is felt at

the empty patch where once it grew. However, with care, this doesn't often happen and the good memories last.

For some people their garden is a place for their collection of ornaments which probably bring back similar memories for them. By way of a

variation a cousin of my

mother's went around the country collecting rocks and large stones for her enormous rock garden. She is long dead now but I still remember her staggering triumphantly back home with her latest find.

However, in whatever way you express yourself your garden can be a place full of personal memories which for me is one of the joys of gardening and each year I look forward to their coming into leaf or poking their heads through the ground once again.

## FROM THE PAST ...

### The Great Bromley Pylons

These were erected from 1932 and were six in number, three large and three smaller masts. There was a story which went the rounds that from these went a death ray which stopped engines of cars on the Harwich Road. Radio Direction Finders were operating for aircraft.



The masts were guarded by the RAF Regiment when World War II broke out and the WAAF's engaged on the equipment were accommodated in the Hutments near the school. Later the local Home Guard took over the duty from the RAF. The Radio Observer

Corps at Colchester sent sighting reports to the Pylons.

Bombs were dropped near the site by German planes on 24th August, 1941.

The equipment was upgraded in 1943 with magnetron-based-centimetre sets and Great Bromley became headquarters for "GEE", the first radar-guided-bomber navigational system.

Demolition took place in June 1970 but masts were left for use by the police and Marconi.

Dear Parishioner,

It's that time of year for the accounts to be presented and annual meetings to be held and the Church is no different in that. The Annual Parochial Church Meeting, as it is now called, is the time when the Parochial Church Council presents its report of stewardship over the past year. For Ardleigh this will be on 26<sup>th</sup> February and for The Bromleys on 5<sup>th</sup> March, both at 11.45am in Church after Morning Worship. The timing is to encourage people to attend these relatively brief meetings - last year at an evening meeting only 2 non-PCC members attended.

The meetings are open to everyone on the Church electoral roll. This is different to the civic electoral register, but open to anyone who lives in the parish or who regularly worships here. Application forms are available in Church if you wish to have a voice. The Annual Report itself will be available to members before the meeting and there is an opportunity for raising factual questions about the report and/or raising matters you wish the PCC to address during the coming year. Each year a third of the PCC is elected to serve for 3 years, and anyone who is Confirmed and a regular Communicant can stand for election. Again nomination forms are in Church.

This year there will be an extra opportunity to discuss the plans for providing facilities in the Churches, particularly a lavatory and refreshment point. The latest proposals are before the Church's planning body at the moment and can be viewed in Church. In both cases this is a result of many years planning and consultation and

represents the best use of the space and resources within the restrictions placed on us by English Heritage, the Diocesan Planning Committee and of course our own needs to secure the church as a place of worship and sanctuary.

Both villages are blessed with buildings that are of national importance historically, as well as being places where many come to meet with God and other Christians to be strengthened to live lives of love in our world. I am proud that we have PCCs who are doing this, and doing it well, now and for the future. Your support and encouragement is both needed and welcomed.

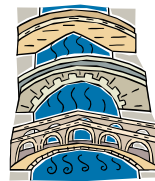


**London Bridges Walk – 25<sup>th</sup> June 2006**

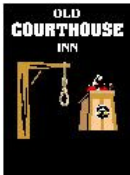

Mr Pettit came to tell us about his hobby which is “corn Dollies” at our January meeting. It is an interest which has lasted for 27 years taking him to many places meeting interesting people. He actually presented the Queen with one of his corn dollies when she came to Colchester to open the new hospital in Turner Road.

Apparently the making of corn dollies is a very old custom as some “Corn Mummies” have been found in Egyptian tombs. Years ago, everyone relied upon a good corn crop and corn dollies were made during the winter months. Each season the last small patch of corn was always made into a dolly that rode on the last cart of straw, also two candlesticks were carried in front of the last horse and cart.

Everyone rejoiced and danced in the harvest field accompanied by Morris Dancers. A new dolly was always hung up before the old one it replaced was taken down, in case they upset the Harvest God. Nowadays, corn has to be specially grown because the modern crops are not tall enough as the straw needs to be one metre in length. Mr Pettit illustrated his talk with various methods and machinery for harvesting the crops over the years.

Our February meeting should also be interesting as Mrs Newman is talking to us about “The History of Gardening”. If you would like to come along to hear the talk we will be meeting at 7.30pm in the Village Hall on Wednesday, 1st February. Do join us.

### Patient choice and Choose & Book

Patients are to be given an increasing choice of hospitals for treatment. For sometime health authorities and Primary Care Trusts have restricted GPs to a limited choice of hospitals. This is now changing and the number of hospitals which have contracts with the PCT is increasing. To assist GPs in helping make a choice an internet web based system is being introduced called Choose and Book.

The Choose and Book system shows a GP the available hospital services they can refer patients to and background information about the hospital such as star rating and waiting times. It then allows the patient to book their first outpatient appointment at the time they are referred. Patients do not have to decide the time and date straight away and can contact a booking service by telephone shortly afterwards.

Unfortunately, Colchester General Hospital's computer system cannot accept on-line booking and is not being replaced until at least June 2006. This means that until then, patients will have to telephone the hospital to arrange an appointment date if they are referred using the Choose and Book system.

Ardleigh Surgery is the first practice in North Essex to start using this new system. It is trying out the new system so only selected patients will be referred using it to begin with. The doctors are wishing to gauge how much of their consultation time with patients is going to be spent using the new system as this is of major concern.

### Dr Claire Stebbing returns from maternity leave

GP Registrar, Dr Stebbing, returned to the surgery on 30th December at the end of her maternity leave and will complete her GP training in August. She had a second baby boy in July. Welcome back Claire!

### Surgery extension obtains planning permission.

We finally received planning permission for our surgery extension and are progressing with detailed drawings with a view to going out to tender in February. We are hoping the surgery extension will be completed by September.

### Flu targets achieved.

Despite all the problems this year with 'flu deliveries we have managed to hit our targets for 'flu vaccinations by the first week of December. 79% of our over 65 patients and 90% of patients with certain chronic diseases were vaccinated by the beginning of December. The only exception is patients with asthma where only 57% requested a 'flu vaccination, probably reflecting the fact that patients with asthma tend to represent a 'younger' age group.

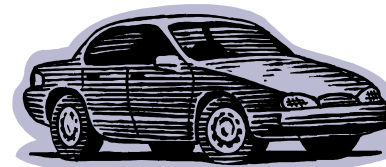

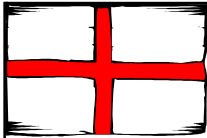

**Report of the Great Bromley Parish Council meetings held on 15 December 2005 & 12 January 2006**

#### Planning

*The Council considered and agreed no objections to the following planning applications:*

**The Two Hollies, Harwich Road** – sun lounge and alterations

**Bay Trees, Parsons' Hill** – extension, dormer and conservatory

**West View, Frating Road** – extension and alterations

*The Council considered but objected to the following planning applications:*

**Primrose Farm, Hall Road** – change of use of (part of) existing agricultural storage to meat cutting plant and retail outlet.

**8 Spring Hill Close** – new bungalow and garage.

*Tendring District Council has approved the following planning applications:*

**Bay Trees, Parsons' Hill** – extension, dormer and conservatory.

**Morants, Colchester Road** – first floor extension and conservatories.

#### Council's budget and precept for 2006/7

The council has set its precept at £13,500 for 2006/7, which is the same as this year. Budgeted expenditure will be £21,260 to be financed from the precept, grants and reserves. The council has increased its allocation for community grants to £2000 and will be contributing £2500 towards the cost of the village hall's maintenance. £6000 will be spent on tree planting and improvements to Church Meadow and the cemetery.

#### Church Meadow

Residents are reminded that overnight parking is not allowed in Church Meadow

and the council is considering introducing a byelaw to deter those who might consider infringing this rule.

#### Community Initiatives Fund

Projects should be designed to promote the social, economic or environmental well-being of a village and must result in the **creation of a new physical asset**. Staff or running costs cannot be funded. All project proposals must be supported by the parish council.  planted in the garden this month.

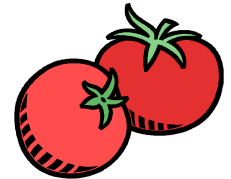
**Irises:** If you have cloches, Dutch irises

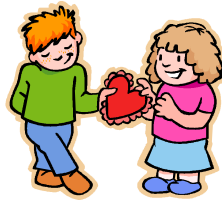

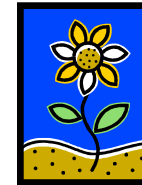

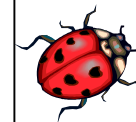
