Dear all,



CHRISTMAS/NEW YEAR SURGERY OPENING HOURS

The normal Surgery opening times are from 8.00am to 6.30pm Monday to Friday.

Over the Christmas/New Year period the Surgery will be closed on:

Wednesday, 25 December, Thursday, 26 December 2024 and Wednesday, 1 January 2025.

PRESCRIPTIONS Please remember to order your December prescription in time for Christmas. You can order these up to 14 days before they are due, to ensure you don't run out over the Christmas period.

SURGERY NEWS We are very sorry to let you know that Sister Susan Webb one of our Advanced Nurse Practitioners who has worked in the NHS for 48 years, will be retiring in January 2025. We all wish Sue a very happy and well deserved retirement after such a long career in the NHS.

FLU AND RSV VACCINATIONS If you have received a message saying you are entitled to either a flu or RSV vaccination and haven't booked this yet, please contact reception on telephone number 01206 250691 who will be happy to book an appointment for you.

NEW PATIENT REGISTRATION SYSTEM A new system has been introduced in England for patients

needing to register with a GP Practice. Rather than coming into the Surgery to complete registration forms, patients are now able to do this on-line by visiting our Surgery website: www.greatbentleysurgery.nhs.uk.

They just need to click on the 'new patient' tab, check they are in the Surgery catchment area and if they are click on 'fill out an on-line registration form'. Once the form has been completed and submitted the patient is normally registered at the Practice within a few days.

If patients are not able to access our website, then they can still come into reception and complete registrations forms but will need to bring in photo ID and proof of address.

For any new patients planning to register at the Practice, could we please ask that if you are on repeat medication you request a month's prescription from your previous GP just prior to completing the registration form, to ensure you do not run out of medication during the registration process.

ASKMYGP UPDATE I just wanted to add to what I previously wrote in the November 2024 Newsletter about AskmyGP which was as follows:-

Patients will now need to request all doctors' appointments and minor illness appointments with our prescribing nurse practitioners via our digital platform, AskmyGP. If patients haven't signed up for this yet, then please do this by visiting our website:

Please be assured that if you do not have access to the internet or someone that can do this for you, then you can of course contact the Surgery by telephone on 01206 250691 and one of

our reception team will put the request through for them. This will involve the receptionist going through the questions that need to be completed for their request.

If patients do have access to the internet, then we will ask them to register for the digital platform. I do

hope this helps to reassure patients and clarify the situation.

HENRY JAMES FAIRLEY 3 AUGUST 1934 – 16 OCTOBER 2024

Henry was born at home in Falkirk to James & Mary Fairley, a brother to Richard and Jim. Subsequent siblings, born in England, were Margaret, Tom, Robert and John. Their father was a dairyman who delivered milk with his horse and cart, their mother baking and selling her goods from the dairy. Mother was known to remark, "My three sons who were born in Scotland did not drink, nor did they smoke, but the three who were born in England *all* drank and smoked!"

James (Jimmy) Fairley wished to purchase land but found there was little for sale in Scotland, so he looked to move to Essex.

Henry was a babe in arms when his parents rented Stock Street Farm in Coggeshall from September 1934. He was very happy attending St Peters Primary school, and going up to Endsleigh School, Lexden Road, Colchester, an all-girls school which started accepting boys, of which Henry and Jim were amongst the first. In 1952 Jimmy was in a position to purchase his own farm, the Grange.

Ann Seldon was working as a clerk in Lloyds Bank and was a member of Witham Young Farmers. In 1958 she met Henry, a member of Braintree Young Farmers, at a Barn Dance where they enjoyed Scottish Dancing together. Despite Ann's Uncle's best efforts to discourage her from courting Henry, by sending her on a pony trekking holiday to Cornwall, their friendship grew. Henry and Ann were married on 29th November 1958 and shared a long and happy marriage together, raising three children: Margaret, Elizabeth and Andrew, and in turn having five grandchildren: Sarah, Alistair, Fergus, Alex and Naomi, and recently two great-grandchildren, Elsie and Liam.

The young family moved to Park Farm, Great Bromley in 1966 with 304 acres of land and the infrastructure in place for breeding pigs. Starting with a herd of 20 breeding sows, all of whom had names, he grew the business over the years. Farm workers included Ronnie Soames, David Daniel, Julian, Alan and Reg.

As usual in family farms, as soon as the children reached an age where they



could get involved, they could be found helping muck out pig pens, mixing up meal, catching piglets, picking up potatoes and grading them, and stacking straw bales.

Jimmy Fairley had managed to purchase a farm for each of the sons, as had been his plan. With Richard and family emigrating to Australia, Henry became Chairman of James Fairley & Sons Ltd from 1982 until 1997. Thereafter he formed Henry Fairley & Son, that son being Andrew who runs the farm today.

From their love of village life, the churches, and the countryside, Henry became involved in many different ways. From his first arrival to the village he was involved with the Hare Green Playing Field Committee. In 1973 he joined Great Bromley Parish Council and became Chairman in May 1982, standing down in May 1995 to George Kempster some 13 years later. He was also involved with the Village Hall committee 1984 to 1991, with the Conservative Club, Thorpe Discussion Group, The Bean Group (Tendring Producers), Colchester Thieves, and Tendring Hundred Farmers Club, being President of the Tendring Hundred Show in 1996.

Henry also found time to enjoy some country pursuits such as the visit of the Essex & Suffolk Beagles to Park Farm, and driving the beaters' trailer on shoot days at Sladburys Farm.

Over the years Henry suffered several farming accidents. As time went on he seemed to forget that although he was young and energetic on the inside, his body did not reflect this.

Ann and Henry's love of Scottish Dancing meant they spent many years as members of the Caledonian Society, regularly joining friends on a Monday night... not to mention the annual Burns dinners. The Society was a big part of their lives until they became less mobile. Henry was President from 1986 to 1989, and helped keep the Society going, serving on the Committee right up until he became too frail to attend





Henry and Ann were very active at both St George's and St Marv's Churches. Whether it was blessing the crops during a Rogation Service at Park Farm, the loan of chairs and tables from the barn for harvest lunches, to "Plant a Tree in '83" with Kathy Hayward, to sorting out the brass candlesticks for a candlelit Christmas service, nothing was too much trouble. Henry was a very practical person and concerned for the fabric of the buildings, in whatever form was needed - restoration of the tower, the organ, the bells, sorting out the tarpaulin when the lead was stolen from the roof, the new sound system, fixing the heating under the church, or clearing the compost heap. He was "a really good, dependable friend to the Church" and his many efforts were recognised in the form of a Pride of Tendring Award in 2013 and then recognition from the

Church in 2023.

Henry was always a good person to go to for a discussion but he was like a Jack Russell – once he got hold of something, he would not let things go! He embraced new technology and was always keen to learn new things, but often called on additional support from the youngsters!

Henry became very proficient at homemade fruitcakes, something which Ann was keen for him to learn prior to her decline in health, having seen so many people during her Meals-on-Wheels days who had little knowledge of even the most basic cooking skills. He certainly mastered the process and always managed to have at least one fruit cake in the tin, and one spare.

Henry led a very full and active life, was passionate about his business and the community in which he lived, and all would agree that the village is the poorer for his passing.

AED Emergency **Did you know?** Great Bromley has two Automated External Defibrillators. You can access these at:

- The Courthouse, Harwich Road, CO7 7JG or
- The Cross Inn, Ardleigh Road, CO7 7TL

Also at the Cross Inn is a Bleed Kit. The kit, provided by Great Bromley Parish Council, contains specialist equipment to help stem extreme blood loss before ambulance crews arrive.

Bleed control kits, also known as emergency trauma packs, are similar to first aid kits but include trauma dressings, gauze, chest seals and tourniquets to help stop serious bleeding. They can help victims of violent crime, those involved in road traffic accidents or workplace accidents, and could be particularly useful in rural areas where ambulance response times may be slower.

Essex Highways carry out regular inspections of roads and pavements, but issues may come up between these inspections. These could be potholes or other road surface issues, damaged street lights, street signs, overgrown trees, or issues with public rights of way.

RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear Friends

Before you get completely overwhelmed by Christmas, with all its necessary preparations prior to enjoying any celebrations, take time to pause, reflect and anticipate what is to come. In the church, the four weeks leading up to Christmas is a time to do just this and is called Advent. It is a time of anticipation and waiting. For the young (and perhaps not so young!) chocolate filled advent calendars help us mark off each day through December. In church it is traditional to light a wreath of four candles, one for each Sunday in the four weeks of Advent with a fifth and central candle to light on Christmas Day itself.

In anticipating the Christmas festivities, it may be that you hope for a particular gift. Children are always anticipating what will be in their sacks and stockings on Christmas morning. Others may be looking forward to meeting up with family and friends at a party gathering or around a meal table. Yet, because of all the celebration, others may be fearing rather than anticipating, wondering what it is all going to cost, or perhaps dreading feeling even more lonely in spite of the busyness

of the season for so many.

From a world point of view, there seems to be little positive news to anticipate a better New Year. Two major conflicts still rage as with many other forgotten trouble spots around the world. There have been dreadful climate warming driven extreme weather events just recently too. So, what is there to look forward to apart from some winter celebrations to offer a brief respite.

An Advent Scripture is from Psalm 24, verse 7:

Lift up your heads; O gates, be lifted up O doors; and the King of Glory shall come in.

Whereas many Psalms lament the woeful state of society with all its injustices and enmity, this Psalm proclaims a grand entrance as in a royal procession, the like we saw at the King's Coronation. It was a procession to take the Arc of the Covenant (a symbol of God's presence) into Jerusalem. Advent is an opportunity to anticipate and prepare for another grand entrance – the birth of a Saviour, the infant King Jesus born as Immanuel, God with us!

This is worth celebrating as it leads us first to Easter and our salvation. And then it leads us on into the future and the Christian hope of all things being made new in the return of Jesus and a new heaven and a new earth. (Revelation 21)

Whatever your plans for Christmas, we welcome you to come and celebrate with us at one of our Christmas services. Why not come to one of our Advent services before Christmas to take time to pause, reflect and prepare for the coming of our Saviour. Happy Advent, Merry Christmas and a Peaceful New Year!
