GREAT BENTLEY DOCTORS' SURGERY

We are fast approaching flu vaccination season and I want to take this opportunity to remind everyone who is eligible, that appointments will be on our computer system and available to book from September 2025. Text messages will be sent out inviting patients to book via a link, or alternatively they can be booked by calling the Surgery on telephone 01206 250691. Flu vaccinations will be available this year for all patients aged 65 and over and those under 65 with chronic health conditions.

As per very specific instructions from NHS England, apart from patients who are pregnant, we will not be able to start giving flu injections until October 2025.

Flu is an unpredictable virus that can cause mild or unpleasant illness in most people, BUT it can cause severe illness and even death among vulnerable groups including older people, pregnant women and people with an underlying health condition. If you are not sure if you are eligible, please give us a call. We are unable to provide private vaccinations, but many local pharmacies do.

By having your flu jab, you are not only helping yourself, but you are also helping to protect the wider population from this nasty virus which can easily spread to vulnerable people who are much more at risk from complications.

Alzheimer's Society

A representative from the Alzheimer's Society will be coming into the Practice between 10 am and 12 noon on Tuesday, 16 September 2025 and will be available in the waiting area to speak to patients and carers, to give out helpful advice and information.

Invites for Vaccinations and Health Checks

We still continue to send out invitations for patients eligible for vaccinations for shingles, pneumonia and RSV and also the NHS heath checks. If you receive a text about this, you can simply click on the link to book your appointment. We would particularly recommend having your vaccinations before the winter starts.

Meanwhile in Great Bromley the blazer and headwear were maroon, with grey jumpers, skirts and shorts, and socks with maroon bands – and I do have a coloured photo of that! Modelled by my brother Peter, about to start off on his first day. Note the NSPCC "league of pity" appeal badge several of us wore in the 1960s.

September 14th 2025

The Deanery choir will be singing at St George's Church, Great Bromley CO7 7TS at the 11am Communion service. The choir will sing 'How lovely are the messengers' by Felix Mendelssohn. Mendelssohn enjoyed early success in Germany, and revived interest in the music of Johann Sebastian Bach, notably with performance of the St his Matthew Passion in 1829. He became well received in his travels throughout Europe as a composer, conductor and soloist; his ten visits to Britain, during which many of his major works were premiered, form an important part of his adult career. His essentially conservative musical tastes set him apart from more adventurous musical contemporaries, such as Franz Liszt, Richard Wagner, Charles-Valentin Alkan and Berlioz. The Leipzig Conservatory, which he founded, became a bastion of this antiradical outlook. After a long period of relative denigration due to changing musical tastes and antisemitism in the late 19th and early 20th

centuries, his creative originality has been re-evaluated. He is now among the most popular composers of the Romantic era.

September 28th 2025

The Deanery choir will be singing at All Saints Church, Wrabness CO112TQ at the 6.30pm Choral evensong. The Anthem that they will be singing is 'A Prayer of St Richard of Chichester' by L.J.White. Leonard J White was choirmaster at St Andrew's Willesden Green, London, until his death in the 1970s. This piece is thought to have been written around 1919 and was published in 1947. It sets a version of a prayer ascribed to the 13thcentury Richard, Bishop of Chichester, which he is supposed to have recited on his death-bed.



Also at The Great Bromley Cross Pub is a Bleed Kit. The kit, provided by Great Bromley Parish Council, contains specialist equipment to help stem extreme blood loss before ambulance crews arrive.

Bleed control kits, also known as emergency trauma packs, are similar to first aid kits but include trauma dressings, gauze, chest seals and tourniquets to help stop serious bleeding. They can help victims of violent crime, those involved in road traffic accidents or workplace accidents, and could be particularly useful in rural areas where ambulance response times may be slower.

Essex Highways carry out regular inspections of roads and pavements, but issues may come up between these inspections. These could be potholes or other road surface issues, damaged street lights, street signs, overgrown trees, or issues with public rights of way.

Report maintenance issues online by using the highways reporting tool. If you think there's a risk to public safety please call 0345 603 7631 or if you have hearing problems you can use the text phone service on 0345 758 5592.



As summer draws to a close, it may be helpful to reflect on what has been happening at the village hall in the last few months and some Management Committee plans for the future. The village hall AGM and Annual Meeting were held at the end of May at which it was reported that the village hall had experienced another successful year, with the volume of hirings remaining steady and an excess of income over expenditure of over £4500 for financial vear 2024/25. Laura Barfield. Andv Lear, Paul Newman, Annie Sands and Chris Taylor were elected as trustees for the coming year and they, with David Beech, Marion Britton, Carole Mander, Dorothy O'Grady and Martin Frostick (who have been appointed as representative trustees by village organisations), together with Kathryn Ealdon and Natalie Smith (who were appointed as co-opted trustees) have formed the Village Hall Management Committee for 2025/26. Mary Fawcett stood down from the Management Committee this year and was thanked heartily for the work she had put into the village hall in recent years, particularly as Bookings Manager and events organiser.

Martin Frostick was elected Chairman of trustees and will also undertake the role of Secretary for a further year. Chris Taylor was elected Vice-Chairman and was thanked for her work during the last year in support of health and safety, fire prevention and hygiene matters at the hall. Paul Newman was thanked for his ongoing work as Building and Maintenance Manager. Barry Hearn was thanked for

auditing the accounts to a high standard and Andy Terry was thanked for his ongoing maintenance work at the hall. Jackie Lear was re-appointed Treasurer and Bookings Manager and was thanked for her efforts in both of these roles during the last year. Naina Shah and Ian King were thanked for their sterling work in keeping the hall clean and available and for being such a helpful and proactive customer-facing team.

Ongoing building maintenance at the hall in the past year has included both internal and external redecoration on those areas requiring it and in recent weeks the ageing heating oil tank has been replaced and the protective security shroud repainted. No major maintenance work is planned for the remainder of the year apart from further inspection and investigation of the drainage system in the vicinity of the hall and rectification of any shortcomings identified. A subcommittee has been formed under the leadership of Chris Taylor to investigate the benefits of investing in a solar and electricity storage installation at the village hall which could lead to a formal investment proposal for consideration next year.

There has been no progress in recent months on the planned car park improvement project as work on the Hamilton Lodge site has ceased for the time being and no formal application has been submitted yet by the developer to ECC Highways regarding the proposed B1029 road junction for the development and the associated roadside infrastructure. Given that the

land in front of the village hall and the car park entranceways are actually owned by ECC it is not possible to properly plan and undertake car park improvements until the details of the Hamilton Lodge works are known and have been approved by ECC. Following discussion at the last Village Hall Management Committee meeting in July, it was agreed that limited funds would be spent in the coming months on improving the surface of the existing car parks by laying more screened road planings, providing two marked disabled parking bays in the South East car park and tidying up the roadside verge and noticeboard.

The Trustees, including the Chairman of the Parish Council, met on the 7th August to discuss the request for the Village Fund to pay for the Power website for a further year as well as sending money for the restoration of the Parish Church bells.

We are pleased to say that agreement was made to send a cheque for £239.82 for the website and the remaining money (£817.40) was donated to the Friends of Little Bromley Church towards the repair of the bells. That takes the bank account for the

Village Fund to £0.00 so the decision was also made to close the Village Fund. The accounts for the time it's been running can be seen on the Village Fund page on the Little Bromley website.

We think its lovely that the Village of Little Bromley have been able to support their own Parish Church in this endeavour and hopefully the bells will ring out over the fields of Little Bromley in the not too distant future.

RECTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends.

I hope you have been able to enjoy a good break over the summer months!

While our children head back to (or start) school, memories of sunshine and family holidays can quickly fade away as we return to the routines that ensured our survival in busier times. I hope it's not all too overwhelming for you!

One thing we might not immediately prioritise at this time is space simply 'to be' – whether it's getting up slightly earlier to sit in the garden and breathe in some fresh air or taking a moment to listen to a soothing piece of music (I recently discovered 'A Song for Clara' by Shoshana Michel, which I can recommend). I often forget to do this amidst getting our four small children to and from school and nursery and getting on with work in our nine parishes, but when I do I am much better for it. One verse I have found helpful in such moments is Psalm 46:10: "Be still, and know that I am God". Instead of trying to wish away the problems that invariably arise from 21

our busyness and the complexity of our lives today, the voice of scripture calls us back to 'being' - to 'being' with the God who made us, the God who knows us better than we know ourselves.

"Be still, and know that I am God" seems like it was written for the so called 'anxious generation'. How often do we carry around burdens and anxieties, unfinished to do and bucket lists and unresolved tensions in our relationships, when the God who made us and knows us wants to grant us His peace! "Cast all your anxiety on [God] because He cares for you" we find in I Peter 5:7.

Why not try to take space simply 'to be' to "be still, and know that [the Lord is] God"? Why not "cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you"? Maybe this invitation is just what you need to help you navigate the busyness and complexity of our lives at this time. Now may the Lord of peace Himself give you peace at all times and in every way.
