THE UNITED PARISHES OF ARDLEIGH AND THE BROMLEYS

Dear Parishioner,

In 1662 two brothers and their families left Harwich to begin a new life in America. They were part of the Puritan movement in this area that felt a new beginning was called for, so at great risk, made the journey to Cambridge, Massachusetts. In true Biblical form they "went forth and multiplied" and there are now thousands of Americans who see Great Bromley as "home".

In June 2000 forty five of them came here for a long weekend as part of the Church's celebrations for the Millennium. Part of the reason for inviting them was to show them that it is a thriving community here, and to put personalities into the picture. Many of the Stones (that is the surname of the brothers) have been and continue to be most generous to the Church, in the past 7 years I think we shall have received £16,000 from them-that's quite a few Coffee mornings!

Now they have invited us to make the journey of the forefathers, though this time the plan is to fly! A gathering of Stones is planned for the weekend of October 9th/10th in Cambridge / Boston

Massachusetts and the hope is that some people from here will join them. I plan to fly out for the week, to visit some of them in the area, and then join them as they visit the places the two brothers first settled in and developed. It would be really good if you were able to join me, simply let me know that you are interested and I can give you more details.

Apart from the trip being a link to our past history, being and thank you for their generous support, it will be a deepening of relationships between different peoples who share similar values and aspirations in life. The Stone family is as diverse as anything we have here in the village; some of them are religious, Catholics, Episcopalians, (that's the C of E abroad!), Protestants and Jews, but most are not. Some are very rich, most are not! They vote Republican and Democratic or not at all. But they see here as home, and that unites us. If you can't come that's a shame, but I can set you up with a pen/ e-mail friend if you want!

PCC MINUTES

The Parochial Church Council met on July 8th.

The repair work to the church roof continues and the estimated date for completion is now December 2004.

Once the roof is finished attention will be focused on another building project to convert the vestry into a cloakroom with toilet facilities and wheelchair access. It is also hoped to build a meeting room at the back of the church, under the tower. Plans for this work have already been drawn up and approved by English Heritage but if it is to go ahead further fundraising will be required. An initial working party has been set up to take this forward.

Everyone is welcome to come to the Parish Barbecue on 4th September in Church Meadow from 5.30pm.

The PCC also discussed Tendring District Council's proposal for a new industrial estate, with a possible 2,000 new homes. We will be informing TDC that the PCC considers it is important that the spiritual needs of potential residents are taken into account, so plans should include adequate facilities for church services. An additional priest might also be required.

There was further discussion about the implications of women priests in the parish. It was felt that the decisions at the last meeting were a true reflection of the PCC's wish that no changes are made during Fr. Nicolas' time here but should he leave and an interregnum occur, then a woman priest could preside at the Eucharist. However, the PCC would wish for a man to be in overall charge of the benefice should another permanent appointment need to be made.


Many businesses and services have already made changes to comply with the act, but, however, it does appear that many are not aware of their obligation.

Public Rights of Way

Great Bromley has 28 recognised public rights of way comprising footpaths, bridleways and byways. These are recorded on a definitive map produced and periodically updated by Essex County Council. The map is available for public inspection through the parish council.

The County Highways Department is responsible for maintaining public rights of way in conjunction with landowners who have certain obligations to keep paths accessible. The parish council through its Footpath Warden (Alan Sievwright, tel: 01206 230791) monitors footpaths and notifies the Highways Department of any problems concerning access or difficulties of use. The advice and assistance of the Ramblers Association may also be sought. The council will also be consulted on any footpath matters such as diversion, creation and removal.

Although the council acknowledges with thanks the co-operation of local landowners some footpaths, even with frequent use, do become overgrown during the summer. (Residents with hedges adjacent to paths and roads are asked to keep these cut back). Although the Highways Department does cut back overgrowth on certain paths once a year it does not have the resources to maintain the complete network to an appropriate standard. However through its *Parish Paths Partnership (PPP)* scheme the county can provide financial assistance to communities that want to take a hand in maintaining and developing their rights of way.

Rights of way will be discussed at the parish council's next meeting at 7.30 pm 12 August at the Village Hall. The Footpath Warden and the County's Footpath Officers will be on hand to take questions, complaints and suggestions and also explain the PPP scheme. The definitive map will be on display. Residents are invited to attend.

The Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000 provides for public access to common land and open country in England. A provisional map of registered access land has been published by the Countryside Agency and confirms that Great Bromley has none beyond the existing public rights of ways. Further information is available at www.countryside.gov.uk/access/mapping.

Roads

The Ardleigh level crossing will be closed from 2330 on Sunday 8 August to 0530 on Monday 9th August.

Motorcycles

The District Council has notified the owner of the land being used as a motorcycle circuit that planning permission is required and that a formal application must be made by 20 July. The District Council has also undertaken an assessment of the noise levels to see if they are recognised as a nuisance to certain residents.

War Memorial

A resident has agreed to look after the War Memorial on behalf of the Council.

The next meeting of the Council will be at 7.30 pm on Thursday 12 August 2004 at the Village Hall Great Bromley.

GREAT BROMLEY PARISH COUNCIL

**Report of the Great Bromley Parish
Council meeting held on 8 July 2004**

Parish Council accounts and audit

The 2003/4 accounts have been approved by the Council and internal auditor and are presently with the external auditor. Copies can be obtained from the Clerk.

Planning

The Planning Inspectorate has dismissed an appeal against Tendring District Council's refusal of permission for a garden store and carport to be built at the Coppice View caravan site Carrington Road.

Tendring District Council has approved the following planning applications:

Meyrick, Colchester Road – amendment to conservatory approval
Arcan, Colchester Road – extension and garage (approved with conditions)
Cross Inn, Ardleigh Road – proposed sub-post office room

Tendring District Replacement Local Plan

The Council had a further discussion of the draft new plan with local residents and agreed to make representations against both the proposed business park and a possible large housing estate. It has also commented on the upgrading of the A120 and enhancement of the interchange between the A120 and A133. The Council will also seek further public consultation on these proposals, which it believes has been entirely inadequate.

After an unscheduled break, "Surgery News" is back! I've been off on a secret mission to test out some of the NHS services currently on offer. Please don't think me biased if the report is generally favourable.

It's the time of year again when we change Registrars and that means a double "goodbye" this year, as both Dr Moutafis and Dr Carter leave us at the beginning of August. They are going to be released on the unsuspecting world as fully fledged GPs and we wish them every success in the future. We'd like also to thank them for all the hard work they have put in while they have been with us. We're going to miss them.

Our new Registrar, who starts with us on 4th August, is Dr Benedict Dewa (pronounced the Scottish way he tells me) who will spend the next six months with us. He is already quite experienced, having done the first half of his Registrar year at Walton-on-the-Naze. We're looking forward to having him here and I expect many of you will get to know him well in the coming months.

The really good news this month is that Dr Steiner is back, albeit only part-time, and very much better than he was. He's gradually building back up to full-time

working and his target for this is mid-August. This means that we also lose Dr Kaufmann towards the end of July. He has been with us for six months as cover for Dr Steiner and like our two Registrars has made a huge contribution during his time here.

Every now and then we will be writing to people who suffer from these and other problems asking them to come in for blood tests or special reviews. For some people this will be six monthly, for others yearly.

If you do get the call, please make an appointment and come along to see us. The whole intention is to improve care. Timely intervention can sometimes prevent problems which seem minor or not particularly important gradually becoming worse - perhaps even life-threatening.

One item of staff news this month is that Diana Woodward has had a well deserved promotion to Reception Manager. Di works out all our rotas for reception staff, doctors and nurses etc, not to mention telling everyone which room they can use each day. Woe betide us if we use the wrong room!

Di, who is from good local farming stock, joined us almost two years ago when she returned to her roots after a spell living in Lincolnshire with husband Tony and daughters Sallie and Lucy. She has been a tremendous asset ever since. You can always tell when she's not on reception as the volume of the whole place seems to reduce!

GARDENER'S CORNER FOR AUGUST

There is still time to take semi-hard cuttings of Hydrangea. As soon as they have rooted, pot up into a 6" pot and grow on as a pot plant. Pinch out the growing tip to encourage side shoots.

Roses: Make sure that the high winds have not rocked them to leave a hole at ground level. Tread the soil round the base of the plant.

Chrysanthemums: Keep well supported and tied in. Continue to disbud. Feed and water pot grown plants.

Dahlias: Keep well staked. Disbud side shoots to encourage blooms.

Bulbs: As soon as daffodils and narcissi are available plant at the end of the month.

Lilies: Towards the end of the month propagate lilies from bulblets.

Heathers: Take semi-hard cuttings, with a heel, of all heathers.




WOMEN'S INSTITUTE


