The council meets at 7.30 pm on the second Thursday of each month at the village hall, with agenda posted on local notice boards and the village website. Residents are very welcome to attend and time is set aside in the meeting for contributions from the public. Otherwise, if you have any concerns, complaints or suggestions about village services etc please get in touch with either the Clerk or any councillor. I thought this month I'd let you know of the various activities that flow from our Church life here to help you and your family grow as Christians.

During term time at the pre-school level, Little Footsteps meet in Great Bromley Church Wednesdays 2.30-3pm and in Ardleigh Thursdays 9-10am. Open to all youngsters, parents and carers it provides a very fun, gentle introduction to our buildings and the Christian life.

The MAGI (Mary's and George's Investigators) are a group of youngsters, in Year 6 and above, who meet in the Rectory on Thursdays 5-6.15pm for activities and social time to explore what it means to make the decision for themselves to be a Christian.

Every Sunday at 10.30am the Sunday Church Club meets in Church for school age children during the 10.30am Eucharist. Sometimes they may be in the pews for the whole service, whilst other

ESSEX COMMUNITY SOLUTIONS FUND

Essex is a County of diverse transport needs, many of which are not easily met by the traditional bus services. Over the last few years the County Council has been working with local communities and the Essex Rural Transport Partnership to identify their transport needs and develop solutions that help meet them. I know that I keep prattling on about the community but your Parish Council will have received information about a campaign to promote the Sustainable Communities Bill, an all party Bill to end "Ghost Town Britain". They will no doubt be seeking your opinion on this campaign, which includes the promotion of local economies, local services and facilities, protection of the environment, reduction of social exclusion and increased involvement in the democratic process



At the same time (in July 2005) the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister (ODPM), issued guidance on Neighbourhood

Renewal Unit's: The Safer and Stronger Communities Fund: The Neighbourhood Element.


This guidance sets out the mechanism for action in the following areas: to reduce crime, reduce educational underachievement, reconnect the area with housing and jobs, stimulate economic development, increase local communities in decision making and promote social inclusion.

Tending has been listed as an area for help from the fund though the example given, which includes the use of wardens as part of a management team, would cost £0.5 million p.a. from a government contribution of £1.5 million over 5 years as a kick start.

So is it a good initiative? The principles are fine but it's the detail that we must monitor, through our Parish, District, and County Councillors.







KITCHEN CORNER

Apple Charlotte



This is a classic pudding and looks good on the dinner table. Serve it with cold, thick cream, or use crème fraiche or yoghurt as a healthy

alternative.

First make a purée of sliced apples, cooked with 2 oz butter and sugar to taste. Beat well, or put through a sieve. Add some lemon juice and more sugar if needed. Perennials: Divide and replant overgrown perennials when finished flowering.

Dahlias: As soon as foliage starts to die back

Bulbs: Lift and store gladiolas. Plant all other bulbs except tulips which can be left until November.

Irises: Feed bearded irises with potash.

Mint: For a winter supply pot some roots and place in a sunny window.

Well, summer holidays have come and gone, so it was on Tuesday, 6th September that the Village Hall committee met again at the Hall. Although more than a quorum was present, several members were unable to attend, an unusual situation for this hard working group of people.

Each year the Rural Community Council of Essex (RCCE) organises a Village Halls Conference, where representatives of those affiliated may gather to listen to the speakers or join in discussion on matters typically affecting halls. This year the meeting takes place on 22nd October at Saling and the agenda contains items such as Risk Assessment, Feasibility Studies, Fund raising from Charitable Trusts and Companies, Awards for All and the Big Lottery Fund.

Every two months or so, the RCCE also publishes the 'Village Halls Update', which is A4 in size and contains about 16 sides of relevant information on subjects such as grants, Scam Warnings, Fire Regulations, Licensing, Car Parks, Playing Fields, Funding, Charity Scams and lists guideline publications available. It is interesting to note that Essex County council has withdrawn their Capital Grant Scheme this year. I wonder why.

The committee review a list of hall projects drawn up to keep in mind things needed to be attended to at some time soon. Last time we looked, it contained about 40 items, now it has 29 of which three are currently being organised. During the past three years we have dealt with 12 or so items, some quite major, but there remains much left to be done, over and above normal month by month running matters.

We next meet on Tuesday, 1st November at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. Meanwhile, preparations are going ahead for the Christmas Fayre on Saturday, 19th November from 11.00am until 2.00pm. Please make a note of the date and new time. Be in it to win it!


